#### **Michael J Frenette, CMC, I.S.P., ITCP, PMP**

Mike Frenette has been deeply immersed in the Information Technology and project management industries since graduating from NSCC's Information Technology program in 1975. He learned and contributed his expertise in technical and management roles for Nova Scotia Power, Nova, an Alberta Corporation and Michelin Tires. He moved into IT and management consulting in the mid eighties, managing his first project as an "accidental" project manager for the Nova Scotia Attorney General's office using methods advanced at the time for mainframe environments such as data-driven requirements analysis, prototyping and frequent product delivery (now called Scrum).

He has since managed projects for many government and private companies while with Synerlogic, Andersen Consulting, Keane, Sierra Systems, and now Corvo Project Management, a consulting and training company he is building. His project experiences have given him domain expertise in justice, policing, housing, pensions, health, finance, manufacturing, municipal, state and federal government, and utilities, to name a few. He has been accused of being a serial volunteer, having

toiled, he says, for more reward than his paid jobs, just not financial. This work over twenty years has given him what some consider soft skills - running boards, thinking strategically, communication, collaboration, in-person and virtual team building. For PMI, he presided over the Nova Scotia Chapter and had roles with PMI Global on the Technology Advisory Group and the Requirements Management Community of Practice. He is currently a member of the Social Media Advisory group.

Mr. Frenette cut his teeth on requirements management during his first role as a systems analyst for Nova Scotia Power in the late seventies. He treats every situation as an opportunity to grow and learn. With Nova Scotia Power, he absorbed process-driven structured methods. At Nova Corporation, he delved into SDLC and then data-driven methods. At Michelin Tires, he learned much about package installations, people management and project management. While consulting, he was able to contrast predictive and iterative methods with adaptive methods.

Mr. Frenette is a frequent blogger, commenter and webinar presenter on his favourite community platform, ProjectManagement.com, which he plugs at every opportunity as THE place to network virtually and globally with project managers.
